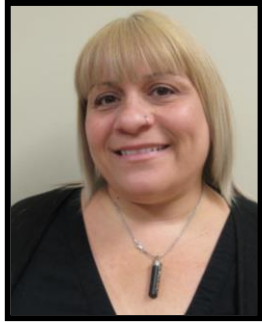

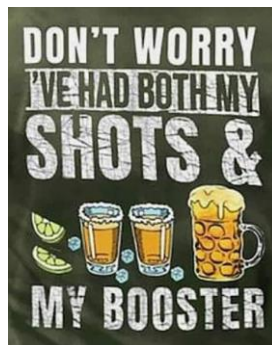
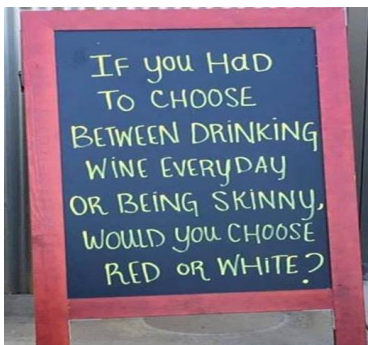

We Will Remember Them

WWII Deaths of men in uniform from Port Elgin and area.



James Edward Jones was 23 years old and working as a baker in Port Elgin when he answered the call to join with Company Commander Howe in the 98th Anti-Tank Battery in July of 1940.

In uniform he married his wife Isobel in July of 1941. Training of the 98th was at Camp Petawawa, north of Ottawa. Just 2 months after his marriage Pte. Jones was taking part in a tactical scheme of a night training operation travelling in a large army truck with the driver and two officers at 1:15 a.m. The vehicle hit a bump on the trail and the driver hit his head and lost control of the vehicle which ended up in the Ottawa River. In the pitch black dark the other 3 survived but Pte, Jones drowned, and his body was found at 6:20 a.m.

The findings of a full military hearing were that "The accident was not the fault of the driver or the vehicle". There were more than a dozen witnesses and Company Commander John Amer Howe was one of them. James Edward Jones had died from drowning and had a small laceration on the top of his head. He is buried in Sanctuary Park in Port Elgin.
